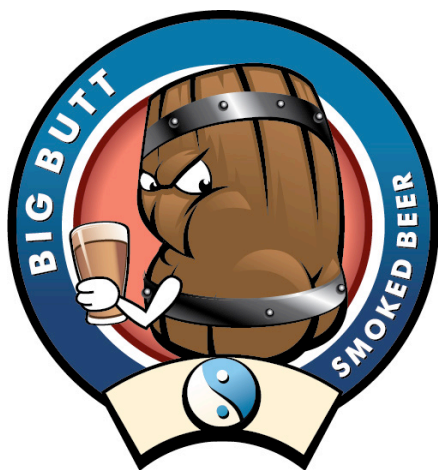

Lagers + Pilsners

Cameron's Lager

The winner of our 2011 Lager Taste Challenge.

18 IBU, 5.0%, Cameron's Brewing, Oakville Ontario, 550 mL - \$6.40, 330 mL - \$4.50

King Czech Style Pilsner

An authentic pilsner with the crisp character of Saaz hops.

38 IBU, 4.8%, King Brewery, King Township, 550 mL - \$6.60, 330 mL - \$4.60

Saint André Vienna Lager

This Vienna style has more colour and malt character than a typical lager.

Steam Whistle Pilsner

Fits into the 5-kilometre diet while hinting at old Europe.

Cream + Lighter Ales

Homegrown Hemp Ale

A cream ale-style brew with the nutty flavour of toasted hemp seeds.

McAuslan Cream Ale

In the style of an English ale like Boddington's.

A crisp, light ale from God's country.

Fruit + Wheat Beer

Denison's Weissbier

Un-filtered and aromatic. The best "white" beer locally available.

A more "beer like" combination of fruit and wheat beer.

This russet ale has a peppery character and a hint of caraway.

Dead Elephant Ale

A hoppy ale strong enough to knock over an elephant. 6.8%

A bold New World pale ale balanced by darker malts.

Huge Cascade hopping and a surprising malty backbone.

Well-balanced malt and hops knit together with their complex yeast.

Beer tastes best fresh. The beer we serve is always kept refrigerated. Pasteurized beer will not be served here.



Porters + Stouts

Coffee Porter

Toronto's original coffee porter. Balanced mocha and roast character. Nitro-tap, 33 IBU, 5.9%, C'est What?, Toronto, 550 mL - \$6.80, 330 mL - \$4.60

St. Ambroise Oatmeal Stout

There is no finer stout available anywhere. Nitro-tap, 45 IBU, 5.0%, McAuslan Brewing, Montréal, 550 mL - \$7.00, 330 mL - \$4.70

Steve's Dreaded Chocolate

Chocolate, hazelnut, bittersweet orange peel, and cardamon. Nitro-tap, 25 IBU, 5.9%, C'est What?, Toronto, 550 mL - \$6.80, 330 mL - \$4.60



Cask Beer

Al's Cask Ale

West-coast style pale ale with a citrus aroma dominated by Cascade hops. 38 IBU, 4.7%, C'est What?, Toronto, Ontario, 550 mL - \$6.80, 330 mL - \$4.60

Hopping Mad

Left coast hops meet an English pale ale and make beautiful tongue music. 55 IBU, 6.0%, Granite Brewery, Toronto, Ontario, 550 mL - \$6.80, 330 mL - \$4.80

Bottled Beer

Blanche de Chambly

An unfiltered wheat beer with spicy yeast and coriander. 5.0%, Unibroue, Chambly, Québec, 341 mL - \$5.30

Creemore Springs Lager

A pleasant lager from Ontario's original cottage brewery. 21 IBU, 5.0%, Creemore Springs Brewery, Creemore, Ontario, 341 mL - \$5.30

Ephémère Cassis

An adult version of Ribena. 5.5%, Unibroue, Chambly, Québec, 341 mL - \$5.30

Ephémère Pomme

Brewed with the goodness of apples. Buy one for your favourite teacher. 5.5%, Unibroue, Chambly, Québec, 341 mL - \$5.20

La Fin du Monde

A Belgian-style golden ale. Try one before the apocalypse. 9.0% 19 IBU, 9.0%, Unibroue, Chambly, Québec, 341 mL - \$5.90

Framboise

Contains vitamin C, antioxidants, and a good splash of alcohol. 6.5% 6.5%, Amsterdam Brewery, Toronto, Ontario, 341 mL - \$5.50

Gluten-Free Blonde

Gluten-free blonde ale made with pear juice. 36 IBU, 6.0%, Nickel Brook Brewing, Burlington, Ontario, 341 mL - \$5.40

Maudite

A strong amber to red ale. Big and malty with a satisfying hop bite. 22 IBU, 9.0%, Unibroue, Chambly, Québec, 341 mL - \$5.90

Steam Whistle Pilsner

Fits into the 5-kilometre diet while hinting at old Europe. 21 IBU, 5.0%, Steam Whistle Brewery, Toronto, Ontario, 341 mL - \$5.20

Trois Pistoles

A melange of cocoa and spice. Please do not point the bottle at anyone. 12 IBU, 9.0%, Unibroue, Chambly, Québec, 341 mL - \$5.90



Glossary

Beer Weenie, Beer Geek:

A casual relative of the genus wine snob. Does not need to read this, but will point out any errors. Plans vacations around beer availability.

Cask-dispensed:

Naturally carbonated and pulled or poured from casks. Not as fizzy, has a soft, silky mouth-feel.

Hops:

Flowers of cannabis relative that impart the bitterness to beer. They are also a natural preservative. "Hop-Heads" seek out only the bitterest brews to be boasted about like hot sauce fanatics.

Malt:

Germinated and roasted grain, usually barley; this gives the yeast sugar to produce alcohol and the brew it's sweet and toasty characteristics.

Nitro-dispensed:

Dispensed with a nitrogen/carbon dioxide mix to mimic cask ales. Look for the cascading creamy head like that popular Irish beer.

IBU:

International Bitterness Units. Under 25 is relatively mild, over 40 is intense. Alcohol and malt sweetness balance bitterness so IBUs are just a starting point. Generally not a factor in fruit or wheat beers.
